	The Asset Apprentice role is an exciting opportunity for acquiring skills in asset / process safety management activities associated with the transportation of gas in our distribution system, supporting compliance with both statutory and non-statutory regulations and delivery of the WWU Business Plan and Safety Case.
	The role is an exciting opportunity for an individual to help shape the future of our industry, as well as playing a part in the de- carbonisation journey towards a more sustainable future.
	The successful candidate will be enrolled into an apprenticeship qualification (HNC Engineering or equivalent) with full sponsorship from WWU. Off the job training release will be granted as required by the education provider. It is expected that WWU Asset Apprentices will work towards Professional Qualifications and become a professional developed engineer (Incorporated Engineer status).
